


Drawing a wild dragon is a challenge, but with the right template and a little practice, anyone can capture such a magnificent mythical creature on paper. This guide shows you step by step what to look out for and how best to proceed.


▲ For the drawing you need a pencil, an eraser, an erasable dark drawing pen and suitable colors according to your personal taste.



### Step 1: Head, Back and Tail

Using a circle and a sinuous line, sketch the head and body of the dragon. Use a thin pencil for this.






# Step 2: Chest and Torso

Expand the body shape into a strong torso, ending in a curling tail at the back.




### Step 3: Snout, Limbs & Wings

Now roughly sketch the open mouth, the wings and the legs. Maintain a natural posture. Use small circles to represent the joints where the legs are bent. Already indicate the claws here.



# Step 4: First lasting contours

Now grab a pencil and carefully trace the torso and head. Complete the first details on the head and add nostrils and eyes.




### Step 5: Final shape of the head, wings and extremities


Use the pencil to complete the body and draw the dragon's legs, wings and spiked collar.






# Step 6: Subtleties

Work out more details such as the teeth, crest and finesse of the wings.



# Step 7: Remove the auxiliary lines

Carefully erase the underlying pencil drawing and all auxiliary lines and add final details such as flames and skin flakes.



#### Step 8: Coloring

In the last step you can colorize your kite. If you like, you can also work with hatching to achieve a three-dimensional effect through the shadow and make the dragon look even more realistic.
